### **The Regroupement des centres d'amitié autochtones du Québec launches its *Portrait of Literacy in the Quebec Native Friendship Centre Movement* to mark FAMILY LITERACY DAY**

Quebec City, January 28, 2008 – To celebrate National Family Literacy Day, the Regroupement des centres d'amitié autochtones du Québec (RCAAQ) is launching its study entitled *Portrait of Literacy in the Quebec Native Friendship Centre Movement*.

This wide-ranging study, available from the RCAAQ website at [www.rcaaq.info](http://www.rcaaq.info), provides a survey of the best literacy practices that have been directly implemented as part of the Quebec Native Friendship Centre Movement by the eight (8) Native Friendship Centres in the province.

The *Portrait of Literacy in the Quebec Native Friendship Centres* also describes the issues and challenges in family literacy and cultural literacy that must be taken up by the Native Friendship Centres, which are located in Chibougamau, Val-d'Or, La Tuque, Montreal, Senneterre, Quebec City, Joliette and Sept-Îles.

The mission of the Regroupement des centres d'amitié autochtones du Québec is to promote the rights and interests of Aboriginal people in the urban setting and to support the Quebec Native Friendship Centres in their efforts to improve the quality of life of Aboriginal people, promote culture and foster understanding among peoples.

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
